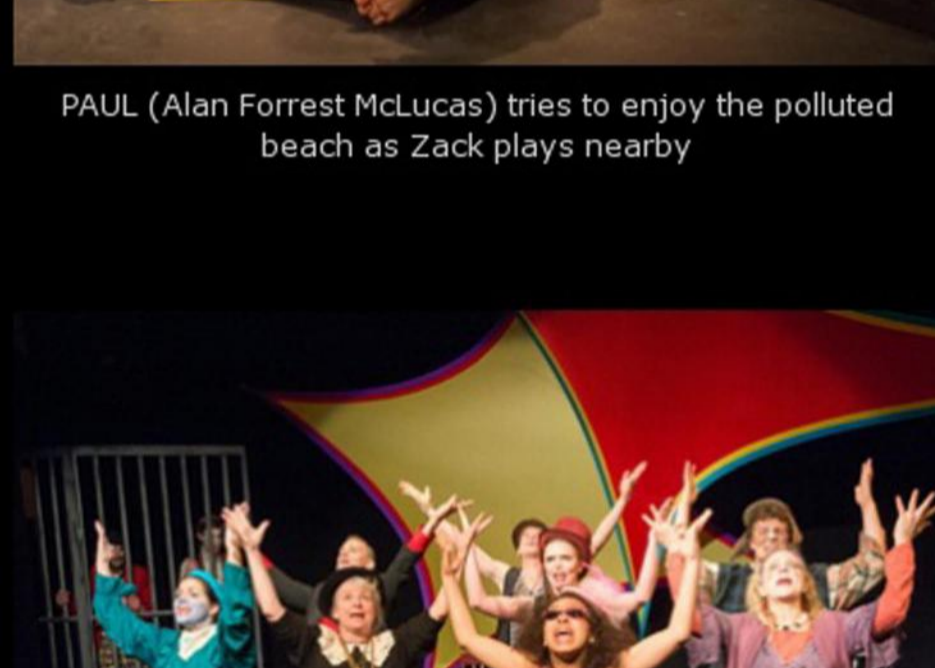

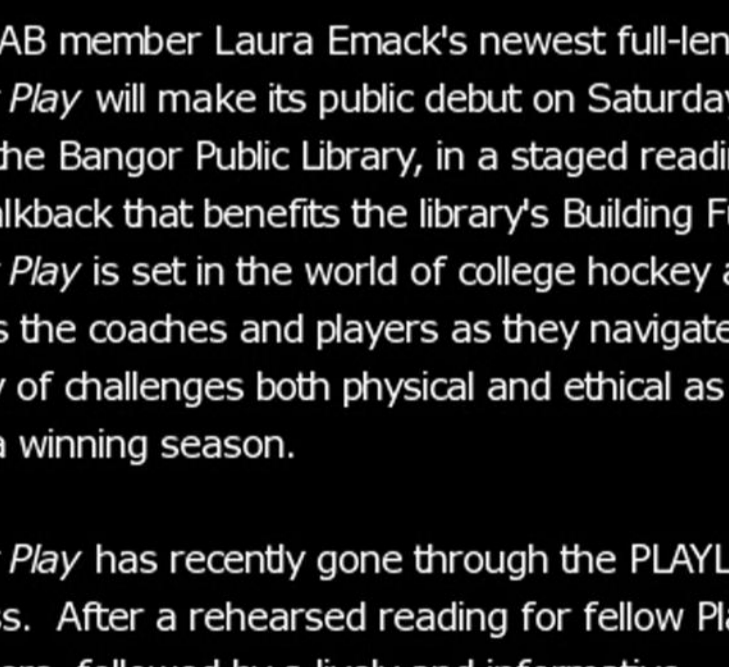
Snowlion Rep to bring PLAYLAB to Bangor!

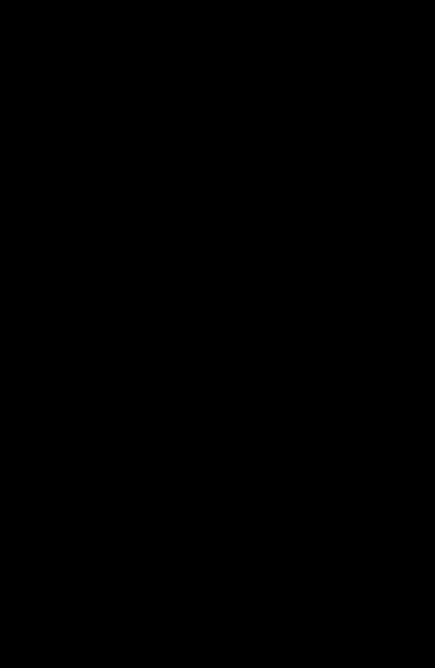
Power Play is set in the world of college hockey and follows the coaches and players as they navigate a variety of challenges both physical and ethical as they seek a winning season.
