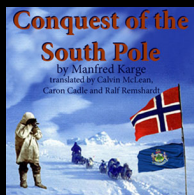

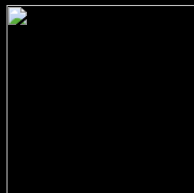

The **Tuesday October 3** PlayLab will feature a dramatic new play by Portland's own Michael Tooher.



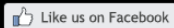
The Perfect Sameness of Our Days
