## The Faustian Legend Resonates Today - More than Ever!

In the time of Shakespeare, playwright Christopher Marlowe created the character of *Dr. Faustus* based on a mysterious alchemist who had lived a century before. Johann Goethe wrote a two-part tragedy about the same character in the early 1800s, and in the late 1800s the opera *Mefistofele* explored the legend yet again. In the middle of the last century, Thomas Mann wrote a novel entitled *Dr. Faustus* - clearly, the character of Faust has inspired fascination throughout the centuries.

When *Faust in the Anthropocene* was first conceived a few years ago by playwright Al D'Andrea, he found many resonances between the story and the state of the world at the time. Events of the last few months, however, have **revealed the show to be prophetic**. Parallels abound, with today's climate crisis, explosion of greed, obsession with instant gratification, and the search for meaning by young and old alike, all themes in the show - and in our daily lives.

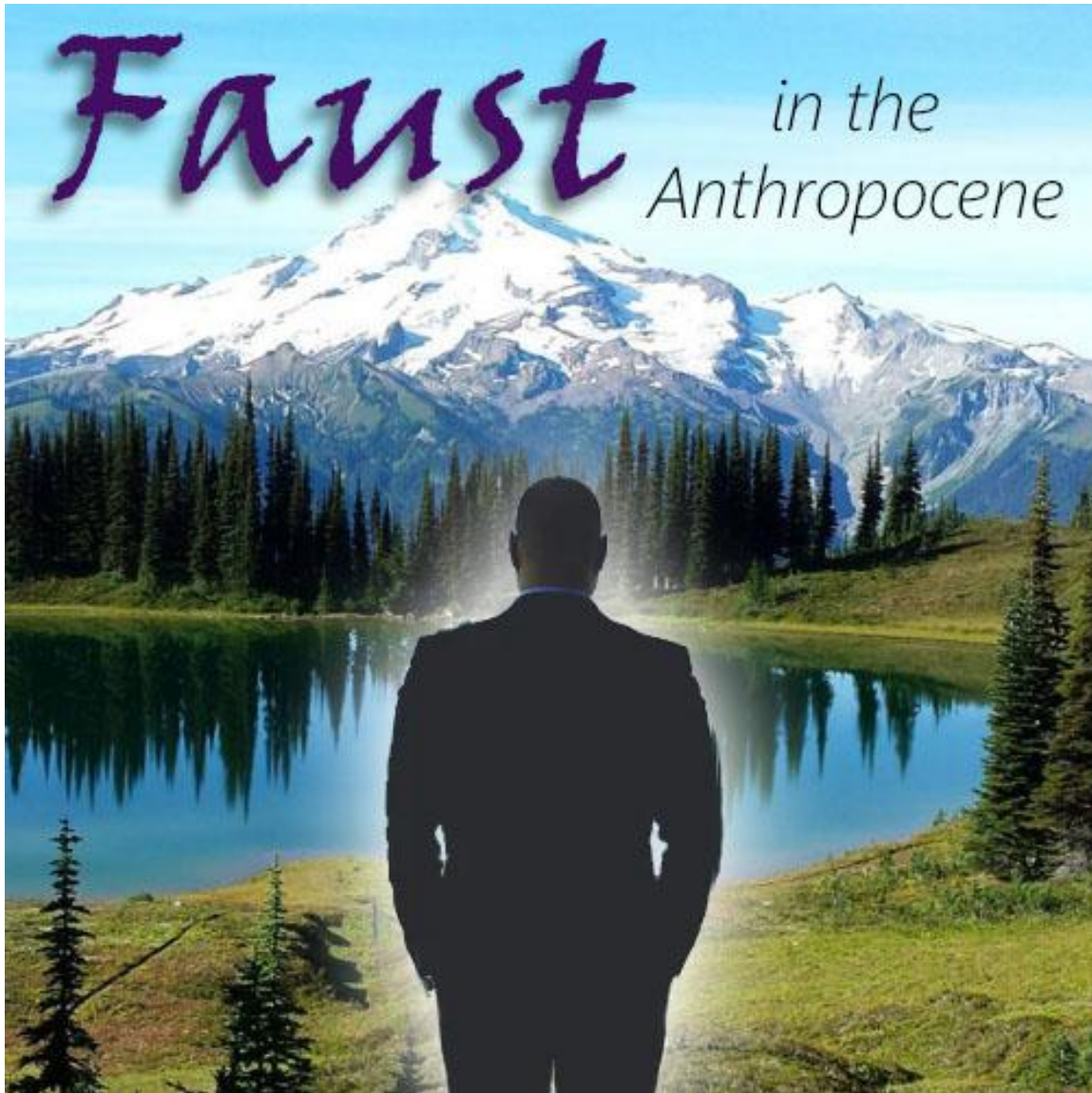
